Mayor Frank Finney called a special meeting of the Winner City Council to order at 5:00 PM, July 31st, 2017, at the Council Chambers at 325 S. Monroe St. Councilmen attending were Curtis, Meyer, Sherman, Baker, Schramm and Brozik. Also attending were City Attorney Paul Jensen, Police Chief Paul Schueth, Planning and Zoning Director Mike Brown, Public Works Director Brent Gill and Finance Officer Rhonda Augspurger.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Brozik, second by Sherman to approve agenda; motion carried.

At this time Mayor Finney asked for comments from the people attending this meeting to discuss the possibility of changing Main Street to a two-way street or keep it the same as a one-way. Clair Turgeon spoke on why and when the street went to a one-way. Doug Sherman DOT manager here in Winner explained the reason this question has come up at this time as the highway is going to be redone in 2020-2021 and the stop light is changing from Monroe to Main Street and the design team needs to know how it will be configured. The citizens attending the meeting and others that had called in today registered as follows: 14 to leave one-way; 11 to change to two-way; 12 undecided. Each council member gave their opinion and will make a decision at the August 21st council meeting.

Bud Jedlecki from the Black Lab to discuss the placement of panels from his business connecting to the chambers panels for this weekend's BBQ pit row. Motion by Schramm, second by Sherman to allow his panels to extend to half of main street and connect to the chambers panels; motion carried.

Motion by Curtis, second by Meyer to place on second reading for passage and approval of supplemental budget #882 for the Administration Building, Light Department and Airport; motion carried.

Motion to offer employment to Snow Poler as a corrections officer/jailer at \$15.84 per hour with six months' probation and full benefits; motion carried.

Motion to offer employment to Kaylea Littau as a communications officer/911 dispatcher at \$15.84 per hour with six months' probation and full benefits; motion carried.

Motion to offer employment to John Janecke as a part-time certified law enforcement officer at \$17.50 per hour with no benefits; motion carried.

Motion by Sherman, second by Curtis to enter into executive session for a personnel issue at 5:33pm; motion carried.

Motion by Brozik, second by Baker to exit executive session at 6:20 pm; motion carried.

Motion by Baker, second by Brozik to enter into executive session for a contract issue at 6:25pm; motion carried.

Motion by Schramm, second by Sherman to exit executive session at 6:51pm; motion carried.

Motion by Curtis, second by Meyer to adjourn meeting at 6:53 PM; motion carried.

Meeting adjourned.
